## President’s Message

There is an old saying that urges “Practice what you preach”. As an organization that promotes sustainable transportation, HART decided this year that the best way to encourage others was to become more sustainable ourselves. There were lots of opportunities for us to do so over the past twelve months.

Our first chance came with a move to a new office. The building was “pre-construction”, so we had the ability to choose building materials that were more environmentally friendly. We selected energy efficient windows, carpet tiles, and low VOC paint. Motion sensors were installed to turn off lights when a room is not in use. A programmable thermostat maximizes energy efficiency. Office policies were updated to ensure that we reduced, reused and recycled when possible.

Secondly, we leveraged technology to reduce our need for printed materials and travel. The “harttma.com” website was redesigned to allow commuters, employers and residents to get information and sign on for programs and services without generating paper. A Google mapping tool was added to give commuters the option to search existing carpools and vanpools that they may be able to join. A new page, [bikehunterdon.org](http://bikehunterdon.org) was developed to promote Hunterdon County as a destination for recreational bicycling, featuring interactive route maps. And, HART introduced “webinars” as a way to make presentations remotely.

You may have noticed that HART is broadening its mission to embrace sustainable issues beyond transportation. Under our **Sustainable Hunterdon<sup>SM</sup>** initiative, HART assisted four (4) Hunterdon municipalities to become more sustainable. HART staff provided support to these communities in their efforts to receive certification under the statewide **Sustainable Jersey<sup>TM</sup>** program. We anticipate working with additional “Green Teams” and expanding the role of **Sustainable Hunterdon<sup>SM</sup>** in the coming year.

It is our hope that HART’s actions this past year, as outlined in this report, will serve to influence others and to advance sustainability throughout Hunterdon County, NJ.

## **Carpooling & Vanpooling**

More than 1,100 Hunterdon County commuters benefit by sharing a ride to work in a carpool or vanpool. (see page 26) Not only do they save on gasoline costs and reduce their carbon footprint, these commuters are eligible to participate in several incentive programs offered by HART.

### **“Go Green, Save Green” Commuter Discount Program**

Modeled after the AAA membership program, the program offers carpoolers and vanpoolers discounts and special promotions at local retailers, services and restaurants. Currently, 25 vendors participate in the program and accept the commuter’s identification card to redeem the promotion.



### **Rider Bonus and Referral Programs**

Commuters who benefit from sharing a ride are the best advocates to promote carpooling and vanpooling. HART rewards commuters who refer others to the carpool or vanpool program, or add a rider to their existing car/vanpool. As a result, twenty six (26) new carpools were referred. Twenty (20) riders were added to carpools; and eight (8) riders were added to vanpools. All commuters continued to share a ride as of June 30, 2011.

### Emergency Ride Home

Commuters concerned about car/vanpooling because they may need to leave work early or stay late on a day that they have shared a ride have no worries thanks to HART's Emergency Ride Home Program. HART contracts with local rental car companies, driving services, and taxis to offer commuters a ride home in the event that their car/vanpool mates cannot drive them home.



### NEW — Commuter Quick Search "Google Map" Tool

For commuters looking to share a ride to work, an interactive "Google" map was developed on the HART website. The "quick search" online tool allows commuters to automatically see carpools or vanpools that are accepting riders.

## Bike to Work

HART is proud to support more than 50 commuters who cycle to work on a regular basis. These hardy commuters pedal their way to a cleaner environment and healthier lifestyle.



### Just Bike Hunterdon 2011

HART has, for many years, promoted bicycling as a commute option with an annual "bike to work" event in May. The event has been very popular.

In response to participant feedback, HART expanded the month-long event to include non-commute trips, simply encouraging folks to bike rather than drive. Participants pledged to replace car trips with a bicycle ride. This included commuting to work and local errands. About 60 cyclists took the challenge this year, logging in more than 6,800 miles!

## Traffic Alerts

With HART's Traffic Alert Service (TAS), commuters can be "in the know" when it comes to traffic incidents, congestion, construction, or weather conditions that may slow their weekday commute. Avoiding traffic helps to reduce idling, which creates 20 times more pollution than traveling at 30 mph.

The free alerts are sent during peak morning and afternoon commute hours via email and text messaging. Over 800 alerts were sent to more than 3,000 subscribers this year.

The Park Avenue Realignment Project in Flemington Borough took place this year, requiring regular updates to motorists on lane shifts and road closures.

## Bike Hunterdon

Hunterdon County is a premier destination for cyclists of all ages and skill levels. That is the message conveyed this year through **bikehunterdon.org**, a new webpage developed by HART.

The site features maps of local bicycle tours including the popular "Delaware & Raritan Canal Tow Path", "Last Covered Bridge", and "Round Valley Roundabout" routes. Visitors find a description of each ride and may click on a route to view full color photo galleries of what they may see along the ride. An interactive "Google" map feature allows potential riders to view amenities along the routes including restaurants, bed and breakfast and other lodging, as well as points of interest.

A full list of all local bicycle shops and where to rent bicycles is also included. There is even a section to allow cyclists to leave feedback of their experience bicycling in Hunterdon. The page is intended to be dynamic. Additional routes, photos and information will be uploaded regularly.

## Safe Routes to School

More than 2,000 Hunterdon County students at eleven (11) elementary and intermediate schools participated in walk or bike to school programs this year as part of the Hunterdon County Safe Routes to School Coalition facilitated by HART.

HART staff worked with schools to introduce or enhance “walking school buses”, offer pedestrian safety instruction and conduct “bicycle rodeos” to teach children basic bicycling skills and rules of the road. Additionally, HART developed “travel plans” for each school to document impediments to bicycling and walking, as well as an action plan to improve or expand walk and bike to school activity.

## Variable Speed Sign Loan Program

Seven (7) Hunterdon municipalities took advantage of HART’s offer to borrow a “Speed Sentry” variable speed sign. The sign was purchased by HART using Safe Routes to School funds. Motorists passing the sign see a display that reads “Your Speed is” as reminder to stay within the speed limit. The sign is available at no charge to municipalities and schools for periods of up to one month. During that time, the sign collects speed data, which was analyzed by HART staff and translated into a report. The information can be used by municipalities for enforcement or traffic calming.

## **“Let Yourself Be Seen” Pedestrian Safety Program**

Increasing pedestrian and bicycle safety awareness for adults, as well as children, is the driving force behind HART’s “Let Yourself Be Seen/Hazte Visible” program. Funded by the New Jersey Division of Highway Traffic Safety, the program provides direct outreach and safety information to “at risk” individuals who rely on bicycling or walking as their primary mode of transportation. HART proclaimed October 2010 as “Hunterdon County Pedestrian Safety Awareness Month” this year and introduced a campaign to encourage pedestrians to use crosswalks. Bright green window clings were distributed to local merchants with the message, “Our Town Loves Pedestrians. Please Use Crosswalks” as a visual reminder to those strolling downtown areas.

## Sustainable Hunterdon<sup>SM</sup>

Through HART’s Sustainable Hunterdon<sup>SM</sup> initiative, local municipalities can receive free assistance as they pursue certification under the statewide Sustainable Jersey<sup>TM</sup> program. HART has identified numerous “Action Items” required for certification (shown below) that HART can assist a municipality, free of charge, to implement or document.

HART created the [www.sustainable-hunterdon.org](http://www.sustainable-hunterdon.org) website to serve as a clearinghouse of information and established a monthly e-newsletter to provide municipal representatives with regular updates of available grant funding, training and technical assistance.

A series of “webinars” was also introduced this year. Topics included an introduction to “Complete Streets” and the value of third party energy providers.

## Sustainability Practices

HART recommitted to making the office more sustainable this year. Among the highlights of HART's efforts:

### Energy

All HART computer monitors are shut off or sent to energy-saving modes when not in use and at night. Motion sensors turn off lights when rooms are not in use. Office blinds are left down on hot days and closed on cold nights. HVAC system is programmed for maximum efficiency.

### Purchasing

When purchasing papers, recycled content is preferred. Before purchasing new office furniture, existing furniture is repurposed, donations of used pieces are sought and remanufactured items are preferred.

### Waste reduction

Printing and copying is double sided whenever possible. Document margins are enlarged to limit the amount of paper needed to print. Scrap paper is kept near printers/copiers for reuse. All printed materials are produced on an "as needed" basis to eliminate waste. Recycling bins are located in all offices and common areas. Inkjet and laser jet cartridges are recycled.

### Commutation/Transportation

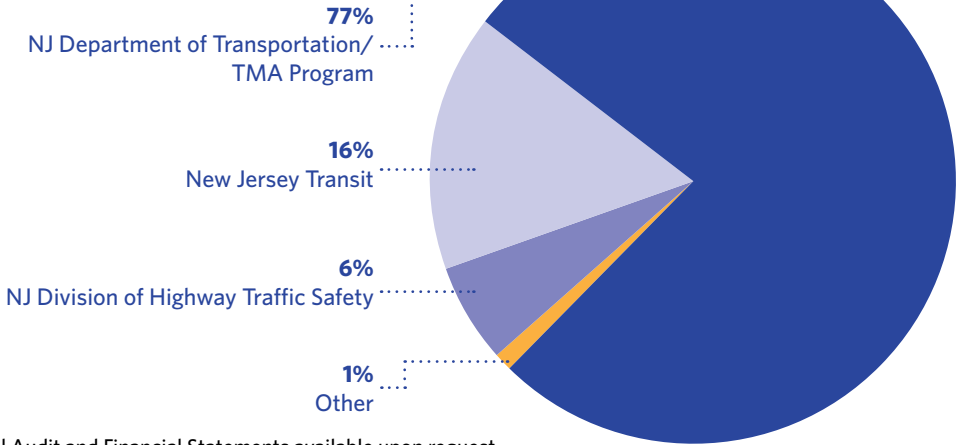
Flextime and telework policies are in place for all employees. Staff members carpool, when possible, to meetings. Conference calls and webinars are offered and preferred in lieu of traveling to meetings or seminars.

### Website Redesign | Webinars Introduced

The HART website was fully redesigned to allow for more "paperless" interaction with the public. All printed forms are available for viewing online. Registrations for commuter programs are accepted via the website. Web pages may be easily shared via social media (Facebook, Twitter) E-newsletters are archived to the site. Commuters may "self manage" their Traffic Alert subscription. Webinars were introduced to reduce the need for participants to travel. For those unable to "attend", webinars are posted online.

John Zengel, a Senior Research Technician at ExxonMobil Research and Engineering, started cycling to work in 2007 when he signed up to participate in HART's Bike to Work event. Soon after, he made a commitment to ride as often as he could. By his own account, over the past 365 days, he biked to work more than 200 times (over 2500 miles), driving his car to work only 9 times! The bicycle ride to work is a little under six (6) miles each way and takes about 20-25 minutes door-to-door.

John has become a bicycling advocate at his worksite, joining other cyclists in giving a formal presentation to the employee council explaining why ExxonMobil Research & Engineering should provide covered bicycle parking. Feedback to the presentation was very positive and the request is under consideration.
