## MILFORD PUBLIC SCHOOL

### Introduction

Milford Borough is one square mile. The school is located on the corner of two county roads, County Route 519 and Route 619. There are sidewalks on several roads, but not on all. Crosswalks are present, but worn. A crossing guard is present. Traffic volumes, speed, motorist awareness and truck traffic are all concerns.

Only about 30% of all students walk to school. Approximately 65% of students are dropped at the school by car and the remaining 5% bicycle to school.

### Current School Policy/Existing Routes

Milford Borough is a walking district. Children may ride bicycles to school.

### Current Challenges

There is parental concern about allowing children to walk and bicycle to the school due to the perceived dangers along County Routes 519 and 619, as well as a lack of sidewalks in adjacent neighborhoods.

Milford Borough is patrolled by the NJ State Police, which does not always allow for regular school based enforcement.

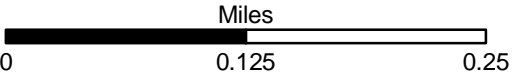
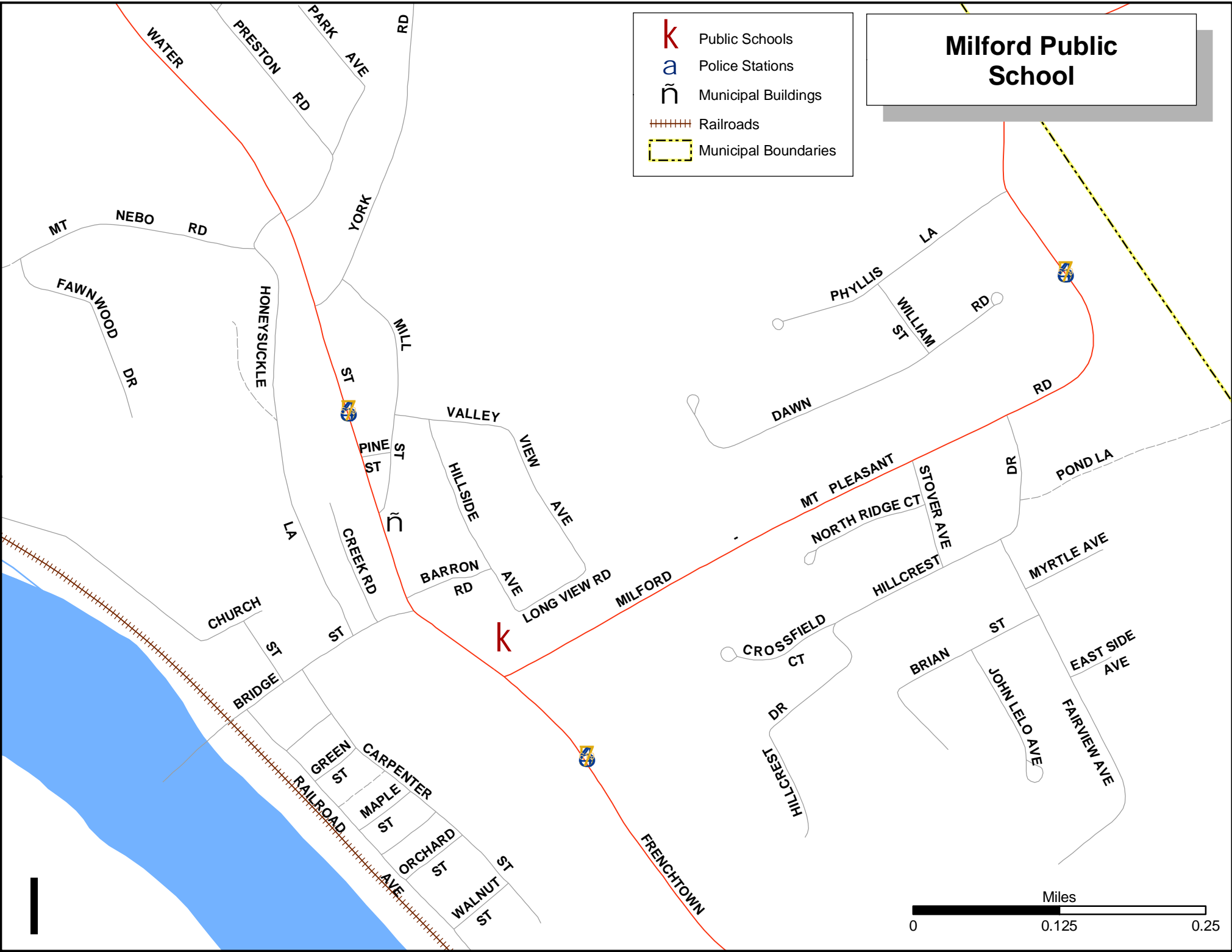
